Our Minnesota manufacturing facility in Brooklyn Park serves as a biologics center of excellence. The facility produces medicines for patients living with gastrointestinal diseases and cancers and has capabilities to support the study and development of future biologic treatments. Our 32-acre campus consists of a manufacturing building with 92 cleanrooms, two laboratories, a warehouse with ambient, cold and freezer storage, utilities production and office space. We also actively collaborate with the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) and many key institutions and stakeholders to ensure a diverse and talented workforce.

We received the Governor's International Trade Award in 2021 for showing exceptional progress and success in exports to foreign markets and foreign direct investment.
